Location: 5000 S. Atlantic Ave., Ponce Inlet

Open Daily: Sunrise to sunset

Admission: \$10 per vehicle. \$20 annual inlet parks pass.

Trailers are not permitted on weekends and holidays without prior authorization from the Coastal Division through a [Special Event Permit](#). There is a \$25 application fee and the form can be submitted via email to RecProCoastal@volusia.org.

Lighthouse Point Park is at the southern tip of Ponce Inlet. The natural beauty of the undisturbed land has been preserved for all to enjoy. Dolphins frequent the shoreline, gopher tortoises can be found in sandy areas, and other wildlife (including raccoons, possums, skunks, armadillos, shore birds and birds of prey) can be observed.

Amenities

The 52-acre park features fishing, nature trails, an observation deck and tower, swimming and pavilions.

Driving directions

From Daytona Beach, take I-95 south toward Miami. Take SR-421, Exit 256, toward Port Orange. Take the Taylor Road ramp toward Port Orange/Daytona Beach Shores. Merge onto State Road 421 East/Dunlawton Avenue. Cross the high-rise bridge, turn right on South Atlantic Avenue, and drive straight to the park.
